From the fancy neighborhoods to Old Delhi's narrow lanes, from the intimate to the collective, Mayank daily strides along the city to track — with his camera — the extraordinary that can be found in the most ordinary aspects of urban life. His blog constitutes today an archive of several thousands texts and photos and many articles have been written about it in India and abroad.
