SUMMARY

I am an applied linguist who combines qualitative and quantitative methods to study communication on sensitive and urgent topics, including cancer, mental illness, climate change and Covid-19. I have been awarded over £3 million in research grants, including 5 years of funding for the ESRC Centre for Corpus Approaches to Social Science (2018-23), which I direct. I have (co-)authored over 90 publications, including monographs with Cambridge University Press and articles in major journals outside my discipline (e.g. *The Lancet*). I am frequently invited to speak at international conferences and at practice/policy-oriented events. My research has had an impact on communication practices in healthcare settings, and is regularly cited in the national and international media. I was Head of Department for six years, hold a Visiting Professorship in China, sit on the REF2021 English Language and Literature sub-panel, and am a Fellow of the RSA and of the Academy of Social Science.

TEACHING AND SUPERVISION

I have over 25 years' experience of Higher Education teaching in the areas of Stylistics, Discourse Analysis and English Language, at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, and both face-to-face and in distance mode. Each year, I supervise 4-7 undergraduate dissertations and 2-4 MA dissertations. I have supervised 21 PhD students to completion and been External Examiner for 24 PhD theses in the UK and internationally.
